

When do I have to wear a mask? Guidance for associates

Effective Aug. 14, 2023

All associates must wear a mask:

- When your County Hospitalization Rate of COVID-19 is high, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Your community may have to fluctuate between masking and non-masking as rates change.
- When you have been cleared to return to work per the returnto-work guidelines but continue to have respiratory symptoms (cough, runny nose, sore throat, etc.).
- When you have had a higher-risk exposure to COVID-19, for at least 10 days post-exposure.
- When you work in a unit or area of a building with a COVID-19 or other respiratory illness outbreak.
- When entering a room or area with a transmission-based precautions in place.
- If you have a COVID-19 vaccination exemption or flu vaccination exemption (during flu season), per Asbury Policy.
- If otherwise recommended by supervisor, infection preventionist, or public health authorities.

Please contact your supervisor or infection preventionist if you have questions.

While masks are only required under the above conditions, all individuals are welcome to wear a mask at any time, based on personal preference, informed by their level of risk for infection based on their recent activities.
